provide unhurried experiences, during care routines and play It should also offer a number of choices of appropriate toys, objects and activities for infants and toddlers to develop socially/emotionally, cognitively and physically The materials and equipment should:

### **Comfort, Play and Teach Activity Program: Toddlers**

Play dough is an open ended material formed into different shapes The bright colours and the aroma of fruit scented dough will inspire imaginative flowers or other shapes Children can explore different math as they make and play with the dough Measuring allows them to count how many spoonfuls, to compare amounts and explore volume

### **Kids**

- Plan ahead Keep items on hand so you can stop and play when there’s time between chores or activities (ex: a small foam ball in the diaper bag) • Play outside in the spring, summer, fall and winter! Dress for the weather • Talk about physical activity Teach children that it’s an important part of growing and staying healthy

**Child's play: Learning that comes naturally**

n Cognitive play uses language and thinking skills and may also include pretend play In this type of play, your child may use objects creatively For example, s/he may use a banana for a phone, a stick for a magic wand, or an empty box for a time machine This kind of play also includes construction play (puzzles, building blocks, etc)
